

PRE-COMMUNION DATE IS SET! By Pat Gibson

One of the central acts of worship within the Presbyterian Church is the celebration of the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Youth and children who have not yet been confirmed are invited to share the bread and the cup of Holy Communion, when their family feels they are ready to do so.



In preparation for this important worship experience, a Pre-Communion retreat is being offered on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>May 10 from 2-5pm</u>. The invitation is open to your child(ren) and a least one adult family member, which could be a parent, grandparent, aunt, uncle, or a confirmed older sibling. If a child has no one available, a Fairgreen Church member can be his/her special friend with whom to share this time.

We will be exploring what Holy Communion means, what a sacrament is and how the sacrament of the Lord's Supper helps us walk through our days with Christ Jesus. We will end our time with a pizza and pop meal! You will be invited to return the next day, Sunday, May $11^{\rm th}$, which is Pentecost, to celebrate Holy Communion with your own family and with the church family.

It is important, also, that you have been baptized or wish to become baptized before celebrating in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Our planning will go smoother if you can let the church office know by Monday, May 5th, if your young person and adult(s) will be attending.

- A. Four-year undergraduate degree programs
- B. Two-year Associate degree programs
- C. Nurse's training leading to an RN or LPN certification
- D. Technical/Vocational training leading to certification or licensing
- E. Two-year advanced or graduate degree programs.

These grants are in the amounts of \$500.00 (five hundred dollars) per unit of study (semester, guarter, etc.) with the total per calendar year not to exceed \$1,000 per person.

To be eligible to apply, you need to be on the active member roll of Fairgreen Presbyterian Church, attend worship on a regular basis and have participated in the life of the church for at least one year prior to the date of your application.

Starting Monday, March 24th, 2008, application forms will be in the wall-box outside the Bookkeeper's office. After the form is filled out, please place it in an envelope (for confidentiality) and put the envelope in the Scholarship Committee mailbox, across from the Pastor's office.

The Scholarship Commission, composed of Dick Schroeder, Pat Gibson, Bill Smith, Barb Roadruck and Rev. Pat Lawrence Shafer, will review the application. Approval for each subsequent term is NOT automatic after the initial grant is approved. Each applicant must fill out a reapplication form, for each new semester (quarter, etc.) More information will be given about this after your initial grant approval!

The deadline to have your application in for the Fall Semester, 2008 is July 2, 2008.

Ed and Emily Foster were long-time members of Rosewood and Fairgreen Church. 
