Christmas Eve ~ Wednesday, December 24th ~ 7:00 PM



UPDATES FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It continues to be a busy time here at the church with a great deal of activity each and everyday. Here are the updates on some of that activity:

- The Building and Grounds Committee continues to oversee the work that Session has approved. The last of the new windows have been installed in the basement and they look as wonderful as the ones that have been installed upstairs in the Sunday School wing as well as in the sanctuary. We are better able to control the heat and circulate the air than we have been in the past and we look forward to lower utility bills because of these changes. The basement continues to be dry and, if the session agrees at its next meeting, work on the bathrooms, the new meeting room and the Junior High classroom will begin shortly. As I sit at my desk writing the roofing crew continues with the installation of the new roof. We are thankful that we realized that this work needed to be done. There were soft spots in the roof and there was leaks in the kitchen. We are pleased that this work could be done before the snow begins to fly because there was a great deal of concern that work on the roof could wait until the spring. And when we talk about being thankful, we are truly thankful and blessed that we have the Endowment/Capital Fund that we do. Without this money from the faithful stewards that have gone before us we would not have been able to respond to these needs in such a timely fashion. Yes, we have spent a great deal of money over the last two years—around \$87,000, but it is money well spent as we continue to update and improve this wonderful church we have been blessed with. By the way—have you mentioned the church in your will?
- The Jeremiah Task Force continues to work as well although we are almost done and ready to hand the information that we have collected over to the session for their decision as to what comes next. We will have at least one more meeting -Wednesday, November 19, **2008 at 7pm in the church lounge.** During our time together we have talked about many things although updating and remodeling the sanctuary continues to be one of our many priorities. The first proposal we received was more than we were willing or able to take on so we asked the architect to change it. We are now waiting upon the new estimate for those changes. If you want to see what was proposed please stop by the lounge anytime and look at the drawings on the easel. It is our hope that the session will present this information to the congregation along with a proposal for paying for the changes in the very near future. Again it is the feeling of the Task Force that we can safely use some of our Endowment Funds to pay for the updates. Yet, we need you to be assured that we will be careful and prayerful with our decisions to spend our Endowment and we will always hold enough in reserve because we know that we often have to draw from it for our operating budget. While some of the work can be done by our congregation, the larger projects will need to be undertaken by a contractor. We have also collected information on updating our organ and our clavinova. We may need to have a fund raiser to cover the cost of the replacements. If that ends up being sessions recommendation it will come to the congregation for discussion and a decision. We will also need the approval of the Presbytery if we are to move in that direction. All of the changes proposed for the sanctuary will allow us to better welcome worshippers and to worship the Lord. By the way—have you been praying for this committee and your session as we as a church continue our conversations and prepare to make these decisions?

Who would ever think that two important missions of Fairgreen could be woven together so seamlessly on October 17, 2008?

The Friday Food Pantry was busily handing out bags of groceries at the same time the Women's Great Banquet was underway. These missions happening at the same time is nothing new, but I would like to share the way they "CROSSED paths". Is this not the way of the Lord?

A man and a lady, new to the idea of food distribution, wandered into the wrong area of the church on Friday, October 17, 2008. Thankfully, an <u>Agape Team Member</u>, hustling around behind the scenes of the Banquet, came upon the two wandering visitors. Seeing their bewilderment, she asked if she could help, and then directed them right to the doors of the

lounge, assuring them that these were now the people that could help them.

A lady, needing some hygiene products, came into the church office in the afternoon of Friday, October 17, 2008. The food pantry was closed but the Banquet was going strong. Darlene Hughes was able to alert the <u>Agape Team</u> of an emergency need and because it was a Women's Banquet Weekend, the church was well stocked with the products this lady so desperately needed. Happily, she was handed a bag, and those who were privileged enough to help her stood in awe of God's perfect timing!!

A local case worker brought a lady to the church after the church office had closed on Friday, October 17, 2008. The Food Bank was also closed up for the day. However, God blessed the Agape Team once again! A team member was at the door/hallway as these visitors entered our church. (On a "usual" Friday afternoon, no one would have been at church at that time of day). After listening to the request of food for the lady, the Agape members introduced the visitors to Rev. Pat, and they were assured that we would try to help her. As the two waited in the lounge, food was bagged up from the Food Pantry. One of our church members had donated, (that very same week), a plastic, orange pumpkin for Trick-or-Treating. One of the Agape Team members spotted that pumpkin on the pantry shelf and ran off with an "idea". When everyone assembled back in the lounge to offer what had been gathered, we shared an amazing realization of grace. Rev. Pat brought a home-cooked meal for the lady, the cart from the pantry held two bags of groceries, and the plastic pumpkin was now filled with all kinds of "kid-size treats" and snacks for her young granddaughter...and where did those treats come from...the Agape Room, the storage area of the "goodies" for the weekend. (God is SO, SO good!)

But there is one more miracle to tell. A Great Banquet Community member, not part of this team, but giving of her time the whole day that Friday, was taking a break in the lounge. Sitting in the corner, she witnessed the events as they unfolded; she too had an idea. Walking up to the lady, the Community member placed a "Footsteps of Jesus" token in her hand, and said, "Go with God". And the lady smiled and cried.

Thank you Lord for Friday, October 17, 2008. May we continue to be graced by your plan.

has asked us to serve two meals that week. As time draws near, a sign-up board will be posted.


